KS3 Curriculum (7-9)

In all years in KS3, pupils study a broad and balanced curriculum, that enables them to transition successfully into working in secondary school, building and developing a range of interests, gaining powerful knowledge and skills in a variety of subjects.

KS3 Curriculum (7-9)

In Year 9, the ambitious broad and balanced curriculum enables pupils to develop their sense of personal identity and responsibility, growing their independence by choosing options within subject areas.

Pupils choose **~20% of their curriculum** in the **KS3 Options Process**.

This process also contributes to the development of interpersonal and collaborative skills as our young people begin to work with different peer groups with similar interests in their chosen areas.

KS4 Curriculum (10-11)

KS5 Curriculum

At Rawlins we have a fantastic Sixth Form and offer A-levels to all pupils who secure the entry grades –

minimum 3x Grade 5's AND 3x Grade 4's

Note: Course specific entry grades apply (Check website)

In Year 12 and 13, the majority of students will choose three KS5 Options subjects. This means **pupils choose ~80% of their curriculum.** (*Visit our Sixth Form pages of the school website to find out more*)

*If you are choosing a language option. At Rawlins, we believe it is very important that our Sixth Form students have the opportunity to continue to study a language at A-level. We have therefore made the commitment to always offer at least one language (the most popular of French or Spanish) each year. However, if there is enough demand for each language, then we will happily be able to offer them both.

SFL and The Base Curriculum

Our MLD specialist provision, SFL (Skills for Learning – 70 Pupils) curriculum mirrors the mainstream curriculum in Years 7-11, with the full range of National Curriculum subjects supplemented with lessons focussing on Preparation for Adulthood in Food, Outdoor Education and Personal Development to meet their individual EHCP needs.

In Year 12 and 13, our bespoke SFL curriculum further strengthens our students Preparation for Adulthood, enabling them to gain further qualifications, knowledge and skills to support the transition on to the next step in their learning journey or career pathway.

Our ASD specialist provision, (The Base – 10 Pupils), supports pupils to access either the Mainstream or SFL classes, as appropriate for each pupils EHCP.
